## **Oral Abstract Format**

Each oral abstract presentation has been allotted 10 minutes for the presentation of their abstract and 5 minutes for questions/discussion at the end.

## **PowerPoint Presentation**

The AAAAI and WAO request that you use Microsoft PowerPoint to design the slide presentation for your talk. In order to load the presentations for all the session's speakers onto a single computer, it will be necessary to collect your final PowerPoint file in advance of the session. *Please upload your presentation to your Faculty Corner. This link was sent to you upon acceptance. You can also bring your presentation on a flash drive to the onsite Speaker Resource Room at the Convention Center no later than two hours prior to your session's starting time.* Failure to do so may prevent your presentation from being shown during your session. Oral abstract presenters do not create or present a poster of their abstract as their findings will be presented through the PowerPoint presentation during their scheduled Oral Abstract Session.
